

## **Introduction**

Karate 3D gives you the opportunity to pitch your talents against friends in two-player mode and computer controlled fighters of varying ability. Fight against white belts (novices) at the beginning and as you get better you will automatically get to fight more agile and more aggressive opponents. Right up to the masters: Black Belts of the Seventh Dan!

When you select a fighter Karate 3D will display the fighter's ranking, and when selecting a human fighter will display this fighter's current statistics of fights and wins. The wins statistic also decides the belt you have, which in turn gives you the chance to fight better and better opponents.

## **Minimum requirements**

In order to enjoy this game at its best, your PC must at least meet the specifications detailed in this section.

System:	Windows 95/98/XP Operating System with DirectX 6.0 or later installed
CPU:	Pentium 166 Mhz processor
Memory:	32 MB RAM Required
Video:	DirectX 6.0 compatible 3D accelerator with 8MB RAM
Sound Card:	DirectX 6.0 compatible sound card

Your system may require you to install the latest drivers for your particular hardware. In particular, please make sure you have the latest drivers for your graphics card. Please check the card manufacturer's web site for latest drivers.

If you are still unsure about your system contact your retailer for tips and details on how to contact most major hardware suppliers.

## Main Menu

Use the cursor keys (Arrow Up and Arrow Down) to move between the possible selections. Press the Enter key to choose an option.

- **1 Player**  
Choose a one player game
- **2 Player**  
Choose a two player game
- **Training Mode**  
Train your punches, kicks and moves
- **Replay Last Fight**  
View a replay of your last fight and analyze it. This is the way to learn and better your tactics
- **Quit**  
Quit Karate 3D and go back to the Windows desktop

## How to start a game

### Single player game

Player name: Select an already existing fighter or create a new one. Use the cursor keys (arrow left and arrow right) to do this. When you select a player's name, you will be able to edit it. If you choose to create a new player you will be asked to enter a name.

Controls: Change the control method for your fighter

Start Game: Enter the ring and let the fight begin!

Please note: that you can only select Start Game once you have selected a player!

### Two-player game

For a two-player game controls are the same as in one player mode. This mode lets you fight your friend!

## Control Keys

Escape: Exit the Game  
F1, F2, F3 and F4: Change between the various camera angles

## Troubleshooting

This section should help solve some common issues that may occur during gameplay.

Q. When I exit the game my Windows Desktop has either increased or decreased in size.

A. Karate3D automatically adjusts the resolution of your Desktop area back to the preset resolution.

If the Desktop size for some reason does not return to normal, the following information should help.

To restore settings, place your mouse pointer on a clear area within the Windows Desktop screen and, using the right hand mouse button click once.

A menu will be displayed from which you need to select, using your left-hand mouse button, the "Properties" option. The "Display Properties" option folder is now shown and you need to select the "Settings" tab. Set the resolution depending on your individual preference for Windows Desktop display.

Apply any changes and re-start your machine, if requested.

Q. How do I check all my DirectX drivers are certified?

A. You can check for a successful set up by doing the following:

Under the Start menu select "Run.." and type DXDIAG and press Enter.

The screen displayed has multiple tabs along the top. All of the drivers are listed separately and you will find a Notes window field along the bottom. Within the Notes field, any problems encountered will be listed. If one or more of the items are listed as uncertified, this could be causing the problem.

Most manufacturers of video and sound cards are releasing updated drivers to meet the DirectX standard. Contact the manufacturer of any component that is not supported and ask them about obtaining drivers that support DirectX.

Q: Karate3D runs slow and jerky on my machine.

A: Make sure that your PC meets the minimum requirements for this game (as above).

Q: What is DirectX?

A: The DirectX platform provides an environment that allows developers to use a standardized format when programming an application.

This makes it easier to support a wide variety of hardware features. Prior to DirectX, developers were forced to write hardware-specific Code (with a specific driver for each piece of hardware).

DirectX is a library provided by Microsoft to run inside the operating system and provide programmers with seamless access to all of the hardware features available today.

If you are unsure whether or not your system will support DirectX, please contact your manufacturer for more information.

## **Other issues**

If you are having a major difficulty with the game:

1. Please make sure you have tried the following:

- Restarting your PC
- Closing as many other applications as possible
- Waiting for hard disk activity to stop
- Ensure that you have all of the latest drivers
- Ensure that all of your DirectX drivers are certified
- Uninstall and reinstall the game.

2. Please make sure you have thoroughly read the Troubleshooting section above.
